<b>Course Rationale</b>

What is required is not so much academic scholarship as an understanding of Christian theology and its implication for contemporary life.</p> <p>The Certificate in Theology makes an ideal preparatory and enabling program for students who wish, at a future point, to undertake study at undergraduate level.</p>		<p>The aim of the Diploma in Theology is to introduce students in a systematic manner to the body of coherent knowledge that is the classical discipline of theology as a means of preparing men and women for well-informed participation in the life of the church and, if students so choose, for ministry in one or more areas of pastoral practice.</p>		<p>The aim of the degree is to guide students in a systematic manner to the acquisition of the body of coherent knowledge that is the classical discipline of theology as a means of preparing men and women for the responsibility of communicating Christian knowledge as leaders in the church, and if students so choose, to the acquisition of skills appropriate to ministry in one or more areas of pastoral practice.</p>		<p>The Bachelors Honours program is designed for students who have graduated with a three-year undergraduate degree in theology and who have demonstrated high academic potential as a means of preparing men and women for advanced research in ministry.</p>
